# Regional Infrastructure Fund Quarterly Report

## INTRODUCTION

This report provides a quarterly update on the progress of the government's \$1.2 billion Regional Infrastructure Fund, which is administered by the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE). The figures presented in this report cover applications (including numbers received, approved, and contracted), funding amounts, and resulting employment.

## DISCLAIMER

This document is a guide only. It should not be used as a substitute for legislation or legal advice. MBIE is not responsible for the results of any actions taken on the basis of information in this document, or for any errors or omissions.

## EXPLANATION OF TERMS

- **TOTAL APPLICATIONS** includes applications under consideration and applications approved.
- **APPLICATIONS APPROVED** includes approved uncontracted-and-contracted projects.
- **APPROVED, CONTRACTED, and TOTAL VALUE** monetary values for the total fund include \$24m operating expenditure for administering the fund.
- **TOTAL VALUE** includes the total amount contracted plus co-funding.
- **MONTHLY EMPLOYEES** is the number of employees working each month on projects, as reported by fund recipients in their monthly progress reports. The term employees is used broadly and can include all types of workers, including part-time, full-time, casual, contracted, permanent or fixed. More precise measures for the work provided by projects are 'hours worked' and 'annual FTEs'.
- **HOURS WORKED** is the number of hours worked by employees on projects as reported by fund recipients in their monthly progress reports.
- **ANNUAL FTE** is the equivalent of one full-time employee over a year. Stats NZ defines a full-time employee as 30 or more hours of work per week. The number of annual FTEs is calculated by dividing the total hours worked by 1,560 hours as this is the number of hours one annual full-time equivalent employee works in a year (30 hours per week for 52 weeks).
- **LOCALS EMPLOYED** is the number of monthly employees that are local to the region, as reported by fund recipients in their monthly progress reports. The percentage of monthly employees that are local is calculated by dividing local monthly employees by total monthly employees.
- **MĀORI EMPLOYED** is the number of monthly employees that are Māori, as reported by fund recipients in their monthly progress reports. The percentage of monthly employees that are Māori is calculated by dividing Māori monthly employees by total monthly employees.

# Regional Infrastructure Fund

## OVERVIEW

As at June 2025 Quarter

**The \$1.2 billion Regional Infrastructure Fund (RIF) is the Government's commitment to investing in and improving New Zealand's regional infrastructure.**

The RIF delivers on the Government's promise to address the regional infrastructure deficit. It will help boost the New Zealand economy, increase regional prosperity, and create jobs. It is administered by Kānoa – MBIE's Regional Economic Development & Investment Unit.

The RIF is a capital fund. Funding support will primarily be provided through a mix of loan and equity investments, although some grants were provided in the early stages of the RIF, particularly for flood resilience. The RIF prioritises loans and equity because these provide for a return of capital which can be used for future investments and it ensures strong commercial incentives on co-investors. Co-funding is expected in most cases.

Five priority areas have been identified to guide RIF investments - Resilience, Energy, Enabling Growth, Māori Economic Development and Water Storage. The priority areas have been identified as key elements that impact the productivity or resilience of the regions.



● CONTRACTED FUNDING ● PAID FUNDING




